CURTIS BANNISTER

TENOR

Described by TimeOut Chicago Magazine as “radiating with slowly simmering energy”, tenor Curtis Bannister has been praised for his vocal artistry and dramatic portrayals in both the operatic and musical theatre repertoire. Mr. Bannister made his professional debut with the Utah Festival Opera Company; stepping in for all performances as the title role in Verdi’s **Otello**. Of his portrayal as Otello, the Salt Lake City Tribune and The Herald Journal, respectfully, praised his “dramatic inflection and compelling energy” as well as his “thrilling tenor voice and a towering stage presence.”

For the 2017/18 season, Mr. Bannister will debut as John Paul in Michael John LaChiusa’s off-Broadway musical **Little Fish** for Kokandy Productions, his debut with Lyric Unlimited as Professor Hornsby/Set in **The Scorpions Sting**, his debut with BoHo Theatre as Jean in LaChiusa’s **Marie Christine**, and recitals with both the **Clayton Piano Festival** and **Cherry Hill Concert Series** in North Carolina. Additional season performances included appearances and debuts in Chicago, New York and Cologne, Germany.

In the 2016/17 season, Mr. Bannister returned to the roster at Lyric Opera of Chicago for their productions of **Les Troyens** and **Norma**, performed as the tenor soloist in **Handel’s Messiah** with the St. Cecilia Concert Series, tenor soloist in **Haydn’s Lord Nelson** Mass for the Baltimore Choral Arts Society, and made his debut as Lieutenant Barri in a reading of **Sondheim’s Passion** with Writer’s Theatre. Additional season performances included Edward Moncrief in Lerner’s classic musical **On A Clear Day You Can See Forever** with Porchlight Music Theatre and a return to Writers Theatre to understudy the roles of Jim Conley and Newt Lee in **Parade**. In September 2017, Mr. Bannister traveled to Toulouse, France where he was one of three representatives of the United States chosen to compete in the **51st Concour International de Chant de Toulouse**. Curtis was also a Special Award Winner recipient in the 2017 **Lotte Lenya Competition** as well as a semifinalist in the **Rochester Oratorio Society** Classical Idol XI Competition.

Performances in the 2015/16 season included a return to the Finger Lakes Musical Theatre Festival to cover the title role in **Sweeney Todd**, tenor soloist in **Mozart’s Requiem** for the Musica Lumina Orchestra, a debut as Don Jose for the Natchez Festival of Music in **Carmen** and a return to Utah Festival Opera & Musical Theatre for his debut as Sportin’ Life in **Porgy & Bess** and the Lover in **Il tabarro** from Puccini’s Il Trittico. Curtis was also a finalist for the **2016 American Prize in Opera** and a finalist in the 2016 **Lotte Lenya Competition**.

Highlights from previous seasons include Mr. Bannister’s debut at the Lyric Opera of Chicago as Peter, (Sportin’ Life cover) in the Francesca Zambello production of **Porgy and Bess**, a concert for the **Metropolitan Opera** National Council, 1st Heavenly Friend in Lyric Opera of Chicago’s acclaimed production of **Carousel** (directed by Rob Ashford), his debut with the Baltimore Symphony Orchestra as Ragotski/Cacambo/The Baron in **Candide** (conducted by Marin Alsop), Monty in the new world premiere production of **Saturday Night Fever** for Merry Go Round Playhouse/Finger Lakes Musical Theatre Festival, his international recital debut of German lieder and Negro Spirituals with the **Musiques de Chambre au Musee du Louvre**, Man 1 in Jason Robert Brown’s **Songs for a New World** at Chicago’s Stage 773, Uriel in **Haydn’s The Creation** for the Waukesha Choral Union, Rodolfo in **La Boheme** for the Repertory Opera Theater of Washington, his professional theater debut in a Shakespearian role as Aaron in **Titus Andronicus** with Stillpointe Theatre, soloist in the Baltimore Symphony Pop Orchestra’s Home for the Holidays Concert starring Shirley Jones and Robert Goulet, and his debut with the **Paris Opera Ballet** as an ensemble dancer in the Maurice Béjart interpretation of Ravel’s Bolero for the Ballet’s 2012 North American tour.

Mr. Bannister has also performed as Pirelli in the off-Broadway production of **Sweeney Todd**, Thomas in the pre-Broadway production of the musical **Amazing Grace** for Broadway in Chicago, and portrayed the role of Andre DeSheilds for the 2009 National Players Tour of **Ain’t Misbehavin’**. A graduate of the Peabody Conservatory of Music and an award recipient of the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions (Mid-west region encouragement and audience choice award winner), Curtis is a proud native of Green Bay, Wisconsin.
